## From the President (by Sam Katsivas)

#### Greenkeeper

I am pleased to confirm that **Tim Dodds** has been appointed by the Board as our new greenkeeper.

As I indicated in a previous email to members, Tim has been working alongside Paul Harby (Henley greenkeeper) for many years and is very keen to assist us to maintain our greens — under the guidance of Paul Harby — until 31 May 2020. Tim is happy to do that in the knowledge that we may possibly want to seek applications from a wider field after that date.

In the coming days, a contract will be drawn up in collaboration with Tim, with appropriate working conditions and remuneration for the tasks he is undertaking.

I suggested to Brad Porter that he join the Board and members of the Club as our guest for an informal dinner at the Lockleys Hotel next week so that we could all say our goodbyes. However, Brad declined, having been very appreciative of the farewell that Geoff Ellis organised last Friday afternoon on Brad's last day. Thank you Geoff for managing that. I have thanked Brad on behalf of all members and wished him well for the future.

#### **Uniforms**

Thank you all for your continued patience with shirts and jackets. I have been advised by our supplier that these should be arriving by Friday next week. As soon as we have them, I will contact every person who is waiting for additional clothing and make arrangements for distribution. In the meantime, please be aware that hats are available from the bar for \$20.

#### Selection

By far the most contentious topic in any bowling club is the one that centres around selection. Selection can be a thankless task and certainly one that causes intense and vigorous debate. On rare occasions it can create personal unpleasantness, which is both unnecessary and divisive.

I will reiterate that if you are unhappy with your selection, the onus is on you to speak to a selector or your team manager to try and get some feedback on why you have been selected where you have been and the reasons for this.

If you aspire to bowl in a higher team and feel you are not being recognised, that discussion can be very valuable both in terms of giving the selectors a different perspective about your game but also because it enables you to obtain feedback on aspects of your game you need to work on to improve. This is the optimal way of communicating and indeed how a good club should operate.

The Board (and I personally) take a very dim view of players who subsequently refuse to play after they see the selection board and disagree with where they have been selected. In my view that is the ultimate act of selfishness and, while I am president, such behaviour will not be tolerated.

Should it happen, there will be sanctions applied, ranging from being dropped to an even lower grade, all the way through to suspension. Our Club, in accordance with its constitution (Section: Members Code of

Behaviour), will not allow any player to hold the selectors to ransom.

Having said that, may I finish on a positive note by thanking those players who despite at times being disappointed with their selection, have gritted their teeth and put team first, rolled up their sleeves and decided to try even harder. You are the people who have great attitude, make sacrifices for the jumper and bring great value to this Club. I thank and salute you — and have no doubt that you are helping to make this Club stronger.

PS. Those who attended the impromptu farewell for Brad Porter will have heard the 'eulogy' scripted by Ian Hodder, which we've included below.

## From the Board (from the Secretary)

Member numbers (excluding Night Owlers) as at 8 October are 107, comprising 81 full members, 9 Life members, 9 associates, 3 Night Eagles transition members and 5 social members. Once Night Owls commences (in mid-October), we'll be able to provide an updated 'total' Club membership figure, which we expect will be around 250.

A quick update also on the Club's finances. As at the end of September, the Club's liquidity (cash on hand and in the bank + bar stock, less debtors) was \$36,043, which is \$20,120 better than a year ago, with the month of September recording a net profit of \$11,708. Thanks to all who have contributed to the improvement in the Club's finances.


