From the President (by Sam Katsivas)

Redevelopment

I would like to convey a very big thank you to the 55 people who attended the recent information evening where I outlined plans for a possible future of the Lockleys Bowling Club.

As I indicated at that meeting, although no official statement has yet been made, all indications point to the new north-south corridor extension of South Road requiring compulsory acquisition of established land. It appears that Torrensville Bowling Club will be severely impacted by this development, to the extent that our Mayor, Michael Coxon, through his council works committees has facilitated meetings between Torrensville and Lockleys to explore the possibility of both clubs co-locating under the same roof at Lockleys, thus allowing Torrensville to find a new home within the precinct of the West Torrens City Council.

At this stage, 4-person committees have been set up by both Torrensville and Lockleys to explore all options in relation to this proposal. For Lockleys, this means that we need to entertain the possible prospect of another club in our facility whether that be as a separate entity to our own club or whether it becomes a new merged club or whether it is something different altogether.

For Torrensville, this is a major undertaking because they have already recently been through an amalgamation, along with a significant works program to establish their new club into a viable and popular venue. Being asked to move again is something which will be very difficult for their members, so I believe it is very important that we allow their club the time and space to consider all their options and come to an independent decision about what their future holds for them.

As president of Lockleys, I will support that process, and I ask our members to stand alongside me in ensuring that we do not get ahead of ourselves, but instead allow time for the two committees to come together and collectively forge the pathway for the future of both clubs.

As always, I will keep you informed and I will continue, through the board, to seek your guidance and feedback as new directions and developments present and unfold.

We have about the right number of players for Saturday but on Wednesdays we are likely to have a few people left over each week. A rotation policy will apply to players in the Div 4 side.


Night Owls "Come & Try" Sundays

Duty Rink Tasks

Before the game

- 1. Raise the three flags
- 2. Set up the electronic scoreboards using the extension cords kept in the storeroom
- 3. Place jacks & mats at the end of the allocated rinks
- 4. Wipe down all seating adjacent to the green(s) of the day
- 5. Roll shade covers across the green seating
- 6. Check & empty all rubbish bins
- 7. Fill the urn and switch on
- 8. Place wind flags on the green(s) of the day
- 9. Place money pouches & table numbers (stored in linen cupboard)
- 10. Place measuring equipment "sack-truck" adjacent to green(s) of the day

After the game

The following tasks should not be undertaken until your direct opponents have departed the club, i.e. these tasks should not be done while you still have visiting bowlers to socialise with.

- 1. Lower the flags and return to storeroom
- 2. Gather the green wind flags & return to the storeroom
- Power down the scoreboard, cover with hoods & return power cords to storeroom
- 4. Return all mats & jacks to the storage trolleys and return them to the southwestern corner of the main hall
- 5. Empty all bins
- Retract & secure all shade covers ... if you need help, ask a tall person

The importance of hydration (by Arnaldo Liechtenstein, MD, PhD, University of São Paulo | Departamento de Medicina Interna)

Whenever I teach clinical medicine to students in the fourth year of medicine, I ask the following question ... What are the causes of mental confusion in the elderly?

Some offer: "Tumours in the head". I answer: No!

Others suggest: "Early symptoms of Alzheimer's". I answer: No! With each rejection of their answers, their responses dry up.

And they are even more open-mouthed when I list the three most common causes:

- □ urinary infection

It may sound like a joke, but it isn't.

People over 60 generally stop feeling thirsty and consequently stop drinking fluids. When no-one is around to remind them to drink fluids, they quickly dehydrate.

Dehydration is severe and affects the entire body. It may cause abrupt mental confusion, a drop in blood pressure, increased heart palpitations, angina (chest pain), coma and even death.

This habit of forgetting to drink fluids begins at age 60, when we have just over 50% of the water we should have in our bodies. People over 60 have a lower water reserve. This is part of the natural aging process.

But there are more complications. Although they are dehydrated, they don't feel like drinking water, because their internal balance mechanisms don't work very well.

Conclusion:

People over 60 years old dehydrate easily, not only because they have a smaller water supply, but also because they do not feel the lack of water in the body.

Although people over 60 may look healthy, the performance of reactions and chemical functions can damage their entire body.

So here are two alerts:

1) Get into the habit of drinking liquids. Liquids include water, juices, teas, coconut water, milk, soups, and water-rich fruits, such as watermelon, melon, peaches and pineapple; orange and tangerine also work.

The important thing is that every two hours, you must drink some liquid. Remember this!

2) Alert for family members: constantly offer fluids to people over age 60. At the same time, observe them.

If you realize that they are rejecting liquids and from one day to the next, they are irritable, breathless or display a lack of attention, these are almost certainly recurrent symptoms of dehydration.

Bar Matters for Volunteers

We have a wonderful group who generously give their time to assist with the running of the bar. Please note that your efforts are appreciated by the everyone in the club.

It can be difficult to communicate with all our helpers so I will take the opportunity to do so now as there is no harm in the general membership (& prospective bar helpers) reading this information.

The main purpose of this information is to try and get some consistency amongst us.

- Firstly, please recognize our new sponsor in the Shaw Family Vintners and promote our 5 varieties of Shaw Family Vintners as our go-to house wine.
- We will shortly provide an updated wine list for you to check when selling our other varieties by the bottle.

- Can all washed glasses be moved far away from the glass washer so that only dirty ones are in its vicinity.
- Can the trays holding ready for use glasses be stacked consistently i.e. schooners & soft drink in one tray and port & pints in the other.
- Please give the wine glasses (especially Champagne glasses) a quick wipe with a tea towel prior to being placed in the trays ready for use.
- When stocking the fridges, can we please maintain the order of products as they are rather than shuffling things around. This makes it much easier to serve people and to monitor stock levels.
- No EFTPOS cash out is allowed.
- Please ensure the glass-washer is turned off at the end of business. There are easy to follow instructions to the left of the washer.
- Re bins for recycling out the back can we please separate white, green & brown bottles. All wine bottles and any glass which does not attract the 10c refund go into the 2 bins outside the cage (this includes the little bubbly bottles).

On a final note, we have a new device to run sales through the bar – some information on how to use this will be available shortly as well as a training session. This allows multiple people to use different devices to serve at the bar, allows for stock control and also allows us to receive feedback on what items are popular.

Having us all on the same page really does make it easier for all of us if things are in the same place all the time.

As we get closer to the season, Mark will speak to the people who have volunteered to help with the 'behind the scenes' roles. They include Jorge, Sue & Michael Hogan, Glenys & Cowboy.

ICYMI (In case you missed it ...)

Club championships

The Bowls Committee has decided to make some small (but we think positive) changes to the format and structure of some of the club's championships.

There will be a higher emphasis on getting the first round(s) of pairs and triples completed earlier in the season. This will be achieved by having Sunday 10 October and Sunday 17 October as designated match days.

We have also set aside Sunday 30 January to play the "grand finals" of both club singles events and the respective pairs championships.

The "per bowler" fee to enter each of the championships is \$7 but if you enter 3 or more championships, there is a fee ceiling of \$20.

Men's & Ladies' Singles Championship

No significant change ... still a knock-out event with games being organised between the two bowlers (marker required).

The grand final of these championships WILL be played on Club Finals Day ... Sunday 30 January 2022.

Our Club Champions are eligible to compete in the Bowl SA Champion of Champions event that is scheduled for Saturday 30 April & Sunday 1 May.

They are also eligible to enter the Adelaide Masters tournament that will be held over Easter 2022 (15 to 18 April).

Men's & Ladies' Pairs Championship

The first two rounds of these championships will be played on Sunday 10 October in order to make significant in-roads into the schedule of games.

These championships are still a knock-out event.

The grand finals WILL be played on Club Finals Day ... Sunday 30 January 2022.

Club Triples Championship

In 2021-22 this championship will be OPEN Gender and is still a knock-out event.

The first two rounds of these championships will be played on Sunday 17 October in order to make significant in-roads into the schedule of games.

After that, each team should make every effort to play games as soon as possible.

Subject to the bowlers involved, the grand final of this championship MAY be played on Club Finals Day ... Sunday 30 January 2022.

Open Championship

In 2021-22 the first round of this championship will be played on Thursday 6 January as three-bowler sectionals.

Sectional winners and "lucky losers" will then advance to the knock-out rounds with games being organised between the two bowlers (and a marker).

No date has been set for the grand final of this championship.

B Grade (Handicap) Championship

Open Championship entrants who do not advance to the knock-out stage will be "automatic" entrants in a B Grade (Handicap) Championship.

There is no additional fee to be in this championship.

Handicaps will be determined by pennant standing/performance and Open Championship results.

Open Championship entrants who do not wish to contest this championship will be asked to advise the Tournament Director accordingly so that a schedule of games can be put together with the championship advancing as a knock-out event.

Again, the knock-out games are to be organised by the two bowlers (and a marker).

No date has been set for grand final of this championship.
