We have to submit the number of teams we are fielding this upcoming season to Bowls SA by this Friday 29th August. After reviewing the membership forms which were returned and making calls to members who hadn't done so yet, the following teams will be registered with Bowls SA.

Saturday – we need 48 players for three sides, 60 players for four sides. We currently have 57, so we will nominate four sides and will work to get them filled each week. No one is going to be happy with nine players on rotation when everyone is available.

Wednesday – we need 44 players for three sides, 56 for four sides. We currently have 48. We will nominate three sides initially as four will be a big stretch, even if a couple of women volunteer to fill in. If numbers increase, we may find there is an opportunity to put a fourth side in if other clubs over commit.

UMPIRE'S CORNER

In a fours pennant game Team B skipper complains to his Team A opponent that Team A's lead is dumping his bowls and is damaging the green. What happens now?

Bowls Australia have published a Greens Protection Policy:

In summary, the process for a player who is (suspected of) causing undue damage to the green is as follows: Skipper A warns his player to immediately change his delivery to avoid damage to the surface. If he is unwilling or unable to do this and the problem persists, Skipper B informs the Controlling Body or deputised representative (usually the Umpire of the Day). If the CB/UOD considers a player is causing damage to a green, the player will be officially warned. Team A's skip and team manager must be alerted to the warning given to the player. If in the opinion of the CB/UOD the player continues to damage the green, the player is required to be retired from the game but may be allowed a substitute player, IAW Domestic Regulation 2.4. If the player fails to leave the green the player will be considered to be a defaulting player and the game will be forfeited to their opponent as per Law C2 and Law C10, and no substitute will be allowed (2.1.5).
