Uniforms

All clubs have received a directive from Bowls SA that they need to be more vigilant in policing uniform standards for their pennant players. All bowls clothing worn, including hats, socks and jackets need to display the official Bowls Australia (BA) logo. The only departure from this is that when long trousers are worn, white socks without a logo may be tolerated but certainly when shorts or skorts are worn the socks must be BA approved. There is even a list of approved footwear that has been published by Bowls Australia.

The board would like to remind all pennant players that irrespective of this communique, that the Lockleys Bowling Club does require its pennant players to adhere to uniform rules and that in fact we should all be proud to wear the club colours every time we step out to represent our club.

The board is not suggesting for a minute that we all go out and spend hundreds of dollars to become compliant, but if as a starting point you can all ensure that your tops, bottoms and hats conform to BA uniform requirements that would be a great start.

Lunches

Our hard-working lunch volunteers have requested a break from sandwich-making. The board totally understands their reasons and would like to thank them for their devoted service over many years. Our sandwiches have been regarded by all as being delicious. They have been made using the highest quality ingredients and they have certainly played a part in elevating the status of our club.

There has been much debate between clubs through the MBA about what should be provided by way of "lunch" during home pennant games and the decision has been left to the individual clubs to determine what they offer. Some clubs have chosen to do nothing at all, while others provide a token offering of cheese and biscuits. There are still clubs who will continue to provide sandwiches.

Our board has discussed this at length and decided to run a quick "show of hands" among pennant players to determine whether we want to continue offering a quality lunch and if so whether members would be prepared to pay \$10 instead of the longstanding \$5 fee, to get the lunches outsourced through a third party. A straw poll of around 35 pennant players two weeks ago gave us a very strong response and forward direction which supported a price rise to \$10 per player.

What we are receiving for our contribution has raised the lunch experience to another level again. Certainly, the feedback from opposition players and our own members has

been glowing, and my personal belief is that these are the opportunities that we need to embrace if our club is to continue its aspiration towards becoming a destination club. There have been a couple of people who have not supported this change as they feel that \$10 is excessive, but please remember that this covers two people and that it is also being subsidised through Stephen Wong's 7t7 Café sponsorship. I ask you all to embrace this change.

Treasurer's Role

This is a second reminder that at the last AGM treasurer Tony Holder announced that he would be looking to complete his service to the club at the end of his tenure (May 2026). We are looking for someone to step into that role at that time.

Ideally if someone is willing to nominate their interest now, it would be most beneficial as that person could shadow Tony between now and May next year to learn the role. Whilst having a little knowledge of financials would definitely be an advantage, it is by no means necessary as the shadowing period is designed as a platform for an inexperienced person to learn everything they need.

Please give this your strong consideration as we do need someone to fill this role.

Umpire's Corner

- 1: When the seconds compare score cards on end 8 the scores did not agree. A mistake was found on end 5, however the seconds could not agree. What should happen?
- A: If during the game, or after completion of the game before the cards are signed, a mistake is discovered and the opponents cannot agree, then the umpire is called. If no resolution is found the end where the mistake occurred shall be declared dead a nil score end (tied end) and the card is adjusted accordingly. The umpire's decision is final. (Law 40.1.5)
- 2: The end is finished; the thirds go to measure but before they can do anything one of the earlier bowls delivered, which is close to the jack, falls. The now fallen bowl is now closest to the jack and is the shot bowl, although it appears that an opposition bowl probably would have been shot if this first bowl had not fallen.
- The rules state that any member of either team could have placed a support/wedge against the tilting bowl before measuring began, but no one had done so. A skip can request that everyone wait 30 seconds after the final bowl of the end to see whether a bowl would fall before wedging it. However these rules do not apply in this case. The relevant rule is 23.6.3:
- "If a bowl falls of its own accord, it must be left in its new position while deciding the number of shots scored continues, and all the shots agreed **before** the bowl fell will count."

Since no shots had been agreed before the bowl fell, the head is counted with the fallen bowl in its new position.
