This year's AGM will be held at the club on Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> May at 10.00am. There are four board positions open for re-election; President, Treasurer, Bowls Director and one other board position. Of the four, Tony is not seeking re-election as the Treasurer. The other three have indicated they are prepared to continue. That should not preclude any member from nominating for any position that is vacant. Please keep an eye out for news from the Secretary about nomination forms, notices of motion and all other matters relating to the AGM.

The board is continuing to talk about the implementation of a business plan to sustain our club into the future. The new indoor facility will be costly to maintain and operate so we need to ensure that our business plan meets the demands of its operation. One of the key indicators in meeting that outcome is membership numbers and the board has determined that at least another 30 – 40 members will be essential towards making our club more sustainable. I ask all members to be proactive in helping to recruit good people into our club. Speak positively about what is happening and get them to feel your excitement.

The council has indicated that they will commence work on the indoor centre by the time we are bowling again in October and will be constructed during the 2026-2027 season. At the end of the 2027 season, work will begin on the clubroom with the aim of having it ready for us to use by September/October next year.

It is important to note that this is just in discussion mode at the moment and we are pressing council for a project brief with timelines and deadlines which will be forthcoming once the shortlisting of the project management process is complete (by early April).

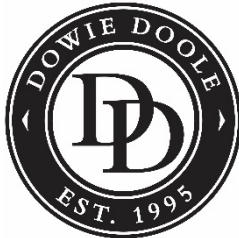

# Membership Director's Report

The season closed with membership at 104, up by 7 on last year.

The club constitution has a membership class of Night Eagle so this year we have recognised this and distributed membership cards to them so they can align themselves with the club. This then bolsters the total membership to 231.

The club needs to grow its membership and to utilise the skills of our existing members to spread the work load.

There are three key areas that the club needs to focus on during the off season.

## Attraction

Have a strategy to identify new players that may be interested in joining the club whether they are high performance, established or new bowlers who will embrace our culture. Run programs for Schools, airport precinct, senior villages in the area to increase social bowls and identify persons who have potential at bowls or volunteers. Also increase our social membership to get people through the door.

## Retention

Ensure we keep our current members at the club. Identifying current bowlers or Night Eagles who can benefit with a winter bowls program. This is critical if we are to field a women's team next year.

## Recognition

The club needs to recognise and/or reward bowlers for outstanding efforts as bowlers or contributions to the club through administrative and/or volunteer activities. This is done currently through the loyalty programs for years of membership and volunteers that contribute that bit extra to keep the club viable.

I'd like to bring to your attention a proposal to increase the Social Membership fee from \$10 to \$20. As we discuss this change, it's important for us to focus not only on the adjustment itself but also on how we can highlight the value of social membership to our community.

We should actively encourage attendees at our monthly dinners and other functions to consider becoming social members. Let's make a point of sharing the many benefits that come with holding a membership card—whether it's exclusive access to special events, member discounts, or simply being part of a vibrant and welcoming network.

By promoting these advantages, we can help our guests see the real value in joining and ensure our membership continues to grow and thrive.

# UMPIRE'S CORNER

A bowl has pushed the jack into the ditch. The bowl is still on the green and has been marked as a toucher. Another bowl hits this toucher and the toucher is pushed into the ditch and moves the jack. Should the jack be put back into its original position or should it be left where it is?

Rules 18.3, 18.4 and 18.5 apply when the jack is moved in the ditch by a toucher. The toucher that went into the ditch and moved the jack is a live bowl. The movement of the jack is therefore legal and the new position of the jack and the toucher that is now in the ditch, should both be marked. If moved by a non-toucher the jack is returned to its original position.
